1. All open class exhibits will be entered on **Wednesday evening, August 11 from 4 to 7 p.m.**
No entries accepted after 7 p.m. on Wednesday, August 11.
All exhibits will be released between 10:30 a.m. and 11:30 p.m., Sunday, August 15. All exhibits **MUST BE** checked out with area chairman for exhibitor protection.
2. Department Awards –All exhibits will be awarded ribbons. Best of Show, second and third place exhibits will be selected from each department and receive \$15, \$10 and \$5 cash prize, respectively. Awards will be provided by the Clay County Fair Association.
3. Exhibitors must be legal residents of Clay County or adjacent counties.
4. The Clay County Fair Association **will not be held responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits.**
5. Entries must be the work of the exhibitor, completed since August 2009 and not exhibited at any previous County Fair or Achievement Days.
6. Exhibitors may enter in as many classes as desired, but **no more than two entries per lot.** Exhibits must demonstrate different learning experiences.
7. Judging will be conducted without spectators.
8. Judges' decision is final.
9. Pictures of Best of Show, 2nd & 3rd place winners will be taken on Saturday, August 14 at 4:45 p.m. at the far end of the exhibit building.
10. Exhibit pre-registration is not required. Entry tags may be picked up at the Fair Office prior to or during entry on the afternoon of August 11.

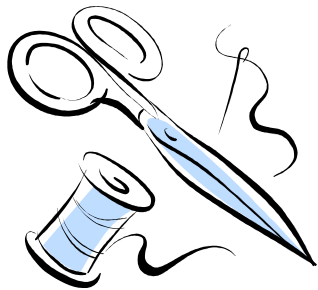

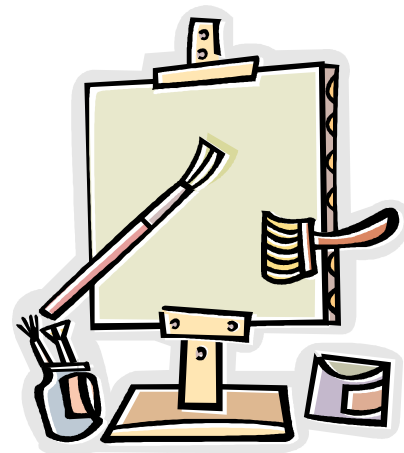
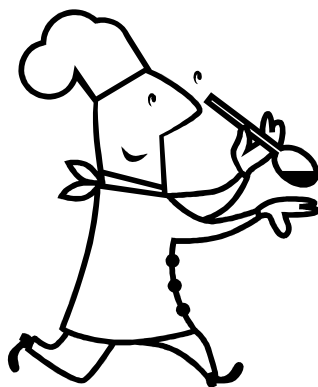

Exhibits must be in standard clear glass containers –1/2 pint, 1 pint, and 1-quart size as noted in the classes. Jelly, jam and preserves must be in standard ½ pint jars, sealed and processed. ALL food preservation must be processed by boiling water bath or pressure canner. Method and time of processing must be placed on label on bottom of jar for judging. Processing times must follow USDA recommendations. (Processing timetables are available at the Clay County Extension Office.) Screw band ring should accompany exhibit. Jam, jelly and preserves will be opened for tasting .

White border on photos should be removed, straight cut edges. No framed or matted photographs will be accepted. Specific photography label must be on back of entry. 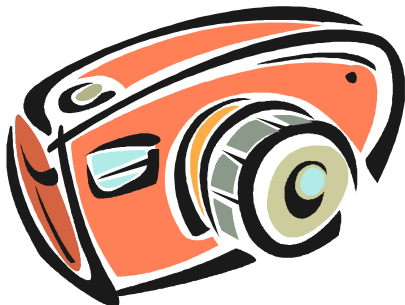

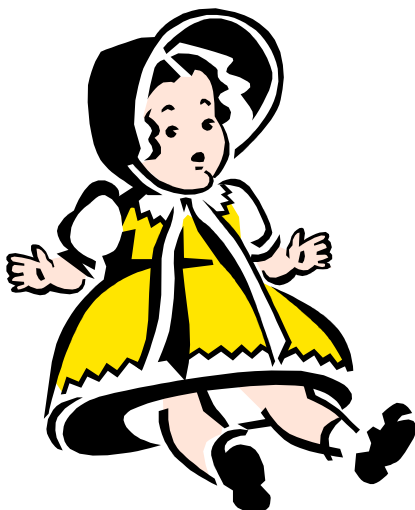

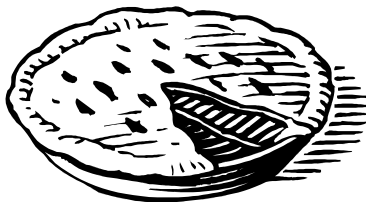


Table Setting Contest
